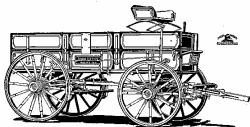

## Ray Young, Whatcom Nurseryman and Deere Collector

Bees and flowers are a good combination for Ferndale Deere collector, Ray Young. Ray started with a single honey bee hive when he was seven years old and it grew into a business when he was an adult. Ray's managed up to 2300 hives(2000 leased & 300 owned) pollinating the apple and apricot orchards in Eastern Washington and the raspberries in Western Washington. Like a lot of commercial beekeepers, Ray got "burned out" and left the bees for a manager position with Holiday Retirement. This company had facilities from Vancouver B.C. to Oregon and kept Ray busy. When Ray retired from the retirement housing business he and his wife started growing plants as a hobby. Like the bees, this also turned into a business with two 30 by 100 foot green houses. Ray notes that no one was hired and all the work was done by him and his wife. This too got to be a little too much work so Ray turned the nursery business over to his son.

Ray grew up on a dairy farm near Ferndale where his dad would only own John Deere tractors. While farming, his dad also worked for Carnation Milk Company. He distinctly remembers a L and a LA John Deere owned by his farther. Through the years Ray has accumulated five Deeres and five other color tractors. He enjoys working on the tractors and sharing the fun with his grandson Coby. You may have notice

Ray and Coby with the tractors at the Lynden P.S.A.T.&M.A. show in late summer. Currently the Deere stable include a 1942 hand start D( originally owned by his dad), 1949 A, 1952 60, 1956 all green 420T and a 1958 420 U. The Deeres are all local tractors with maybe the exception of the John Deere 60. The all green 420T and the 1942 D are probably the most unusual of the group. Ray also owns two Ford 8Ns, a 1949 model and a 1951. He owns a model D Gibson and a model A. He collection is topped off with a 1946 Farmall H.

Ray does most of the restoring work himself and enjoys seeing the product when the job is done. He works on only one tractor at a time, no multi tasking for him. Ray is very proud that his grandson, Coby, who is 14 years now is still very interested in the collection. You might see Colby doing the slow race with that 60 next year. Watch out Paul Hieb and Gary Friend, competition is on the way! A tip of the green and yellow hat to Ray Young, our Fall 2007 featured member. **ajohnson.**

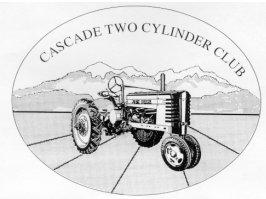
## Late Summer Events!

Our summer caravan was a big success on Fir Island and back to Barnett Implement for the tractor display and lunch. Thanks Tom!

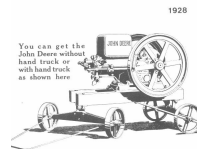
Next meeting will be October 27 at 10:00 a.m. at the Sedro Woolley Museum.

## Separating the Chaff from the Grain

I must draw attention again to the Deerey Departed parts people at [www.DeereyDeparted.Us](http://www.DeereyDeparted.Us) or 309-787-1432. I mentioned earlier that they have a good selection of airloc fasteners for the Dubuque tractors (M, 40.420 & 430 series). I believe that Deere still sells the airloc fasteners but are about four times more expensive than Deerey Departed. This business continues to expand their offerings with hard to find detail parts for the old Deeres. The latest items are replica choke and starter knobs for the classic Deeres. Deere sells knobs but they aren't the same as the originals. I have bought from Deerey Departed online and I usually have the items in several days. Shipping is expensive so bundle your orders. Steiner Tractor Parts, Inc at 810-621-3000 continues to expand their classic tractor parts and now offers most parts for restoring the original tractor lights. Now you can get the light reflector, bulb socket and correct bulb as well as the lens and gasket. Generator voltage regulators and conversion kits for cut out relays are also available. Most new tractor parts stores have access to the same parts so it pays to shop around and consider service and not just price alone. I must compliment the part folks at North Washington Implement, Barnetts and Summner Tractor for their hard work in locating parts for the Deeres. Like they say, if there is the demand they will make it!

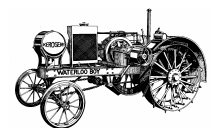
