Well I didn't want to, but they made me do it! The Cascade 2 Cylinder Club board has been harassing me for some time now to do the featured member column on myself. Soooo here goes.

I got my interest in John Deeres many years ago on my parent's dairy farm north of Lynden. My dad was a Deere guy who did buy some red and orange equipment to complement the Deere tractor but he quickly reverted back to green. The John Deere equipment was good and reliable but the dealership really made the difference. I remember as a little kid being given a toy John Deere tractor by the North Washington Implement owner, John Spaan. Boy, was that a great marketing strategy! During my early years in high school several of my friends and I would walk to the Lynden John Deere dealership during lunch hour to inspect the latest Deere models. Now a days most stores or dealerships don't want a bunch of young teenagers hanging around their store but not so in the 1960's. I can remember some of the used tractors and of course the new models that I wished my dad would buy to replace our 1949 John Deere B. The B was still a good solid tractor but the JD 530 and 630 had power steering, live pto., live hydraulics and that really sharp yellow strip on the hood and radiator cowl-ing. During my junior year of high school, one of my Deere friends put me on to a 1929 John Deere near Deming, Washington. My friend's dad had a 1930's model D on steel that he claimed was the best tractor ever! I checked out the 1929 D and bought it for \$75. The real struggle on this deal was getting this non running tractor on "steel" from Deming to our farm north of Lynden.

Our Lynden High School shop teacher, Stan Sleeth came to the rescue and offered me the F.F.A. student constructed equipment trailer. Transportation problem solved and I had this old D running in a matter of weeks. About the same time, I was lucky to get my dad to buy me a styled John Deere L with mower, plow and spring tooth harrow. This tractor was used to cultivate my 1/2 acre of raspberries that I grew during high school. Unfortunately I sold the little L and equipment when I got out of high school. I think everyone has one of those "I wished I would have kept it stories". Each tractor has a good story but for lack of column space I will save the rest of the stories for another day. My Deere acquisition went on hold until the early 1990's when I got the green fever again. One weekend, when I was visiting my parents, I drove by a John Deere D and R on the corner of the Guide Meridian and East Badge Road north of Lynden. A guy by the name of Fred Polinder owned the tractors and my brother bought the D and I came home with the 1949 R. My son Curtis, who was in elementary school really thought that tractor was great! Not long afterwards, a John Deere 40C with tool bar blade and plow was added to the collection. I inherited the family farm John Deere MT and took ownership of a 1950 rusty Skagit Valley M from my niece. The M was the first tractor that I can say that I restored and has been at many shows, parades and caravans. It's never wise to tell about all the tractors you own but I will say that I have at least one M, a MT, R, 40C, LA and the D. I do jointly own a JD 60 and JD430C with my brother. Old John Deere implements intrigue me and I have a few John Deere plows, mowers and loaders. Currently I

Separating the Chaff from the Grain

We can see the "light at the end of the tunnel" with \$4000 left to pay on the replica John Deere dealership building at Berthusen's Park, Lynden. The \$4000 is owed to the P.S.A.T.&M.A. club with four years to pay off the debt. Being the good people we are, we would like to retire the debt sooner so the Lynden club can use the money for another park project. The building is complete on the outside and 99% done on the inside. I think we owe our selves a big pat on the back for a job well done! **Please help** with the final push to get the building fund paid off! Tax deductible you know and your name on a plaque.

The temperatures are dropping and tractor anti freeze levels should have been checked by now. Keep in mind that most of our tractor cooling systems are thermo siphoning design and anti freeze should be mixed with water when adding or make sure the engine has been run hot to mix the anti freeze solution. It's a good idea to run the engines every month or two to warm up the system. Driving them is even better! The damp, wet winter months

seem to take its toll on the electrical and mechanical parts. Trickle chargers are good things for the batteries and just make sure you don't let the battery go "dead" or "cook" it with overcharging with the old style battery chargers. Six volt batteries have taken a big jump in price the last year or so. This is a good time to check for wheel corrosion around the valve stems. The old calcium solution can ruin a rim in weeks and cost a lot to repair or replace. Most of the agriculture tire stores have a better non corrosive solution if you feel you need for extra wheel weight.

Our Deere friends from the Chehalis area have been "burned out" from doing another EXPO in 2009. If you have any interest in another EXPO in the future contact our club officers or directors.

Tom Jensen has retired his Tesoro I.D. badge and deserves a hand of congratulation for his 30 years plus service making the stuff that makes your car, truck, tractor and airplane run. The downside of Tom's retirement is that we lost the free copy work of our C2CC newsletter. We run around 250 copies an edition which is going to cost \$80 to \$100. We are looking for another member like Tom who had a employer that was willing to run the copies for free. Ideas? We may need to raise our dues in the future to off set the new copy cost.

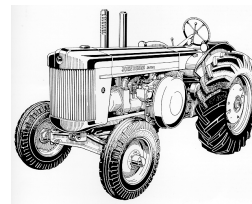

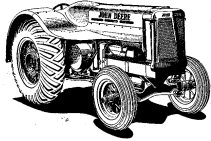
