

The Beginning

It hardly seems possible that the first official meeting of the Cascade Two Cylinder Club happened just twenty years ago on February 25, 1993 at the Sedro Woolley Museum. With the help of Jay Fryman from the Two Cylinder Club, Ray Vandingham and local collectors Paul Hieb, Bob Harrison and Willis Mills, the club was off to a grand start. The Club boasted 50 plus charter members that first year representing North Puget Sound and Southern British Columbia. The first officers included an enthusiastic President Paul Hieb, Vice President Jerry Senner, Secretary Morrie Robinson (who also served as the first newsletter editor), and Treasurer Tom Jensen. Board members included Lloyd Kincade, Merlin Granberg, Tony Splane, Norm teSelle, Ray Riggles, Curtis Johnson, Alerd Johnson and Addy Johnson.

The Devil and the Details

Perhaps the greatest decision the group had to resolve was to be "loose knit" or the extreme of being "fully organized". The loose knit philosophy won out as long as the group had insurance and was legal in the eyes of Washington State. A major guiding light for the new group was Ray Vanlandingham who had positive experience forming a John Deere Club in Southern Washington. Ray explained the pitfalls of a club owning equipment and the importance of a newsletter in communicating with the membership. Fortunately, our founding fathers listened to Ray and the club doesn't own any major equipment which needs constant maintenance. A newsletter and web page was developed to communicate with the membership. Morrie Robinson was another valuable resource in sharing his wealth of experience and involvement with the local Branch 26 small engine club.

Showing Off the Green and Yellow

What good is collecting and restoring green and yellow iron (Deere engineering marvels) if you can't show it off to your buddies and the public! Many members were already displaying their treasurers at the Lynden summer Puget Sound Antique Tractor & Machinery Association show but wanted their very own show. Ah ha! Why not start their very own spring plow day? The very first annual spring plow day was successfully conducted in 1994 at the Ron Knutsen farm next to I-5 Burlington. They even had freeway traffic pulling off on the shoulder to watch the 23 acres of dirt fly. Enthusiasm ran rampant and a fall plow day was added in 1995. That year also provided the club with the first North West Two Cylinder EXPO in Chehalis, Washington. The club had a good showing with over twenty tractors in the exclusive northwest John Deere event. Some of our members made us proud in the tractor pull and slow race. North West Two Cylinder EXPO was such a success that the event continued every two years from 1995 to 2007. And then there was the 1999 National Two Cylinder Club EXPO held in Missoula, Montana. Nine club tractors were present and nearly two dozen members attended. Ken Langel was a crowd pleaser when he started up the Waterloo Boy. A member hasn't exhibited since until the summer of 2002 when Paul Hieb and Allan Brinson hauled Paul's rare 1947 BWH to EXPO XII in Waterloo, Iowa. Way to go Paul! 2001 was the year of the John Deere at the Lynden P.S.A.T. &M.A. summer show. Tom Jensen was nominated show director and replicated a "30 years of the "D" display. 190 beautiful Deeres were exhibited. And then there are the local parades! Lynden Farmer's Day, Burlington Berry Dairy Days, Sedro Woolley Logger Rodeo parade, and the Arlington Forth of July parade. The Governor's Trophy and Best of Division are some the awards won by our parade participants.

You Can't Celebrate without Food

The Cascade Two Cylinder Club annual holiday potluck started in 1995 at the Alger Community Center. Like with many things, when you have good food and good talk the event grows and grows until you've outgrown your hall. In December 1998 the holiday potluck was moved to the Bay View Community Center where the club

has had up to 130 people plus in attendance. Besides good food, the club sponsored a big raffle, door prizes and entertainment by professional musicians. One member says that the annual club dues are worth just the holiday potluck dinner.

Who Are We Now?

The Cascade Two Cylinder Club has grown from 50 charter members in 1993 to over 180 members in 2003 and about the same number in 2013. Membership ranges from as far north as British Columbia to as far south as California. The majority of the members hail from Whatcom, Skagit, Snohomish, San Juan and Island counties. The membership owns in excess of 300 two cylinder John Deere tractors and various antiques implements. Tractors are exhibited at the Branch 26 Mid Winter Gas Up, P.S.A.T.&M.A summer show, Anacortes Antique Engine & Machine Show and the local John Deere Day. Parades include the Lynden Farmers Day Parade, Burlington Berry Dairy Day Parade, Sedro Woolley Logger Rodeo Parade, Arlington Parade and the Stanwood Parade. The club has been helping Oscar and Nels Lagerlund with the Bellville Threshing show for ten years. This has been a great hands on use of our tractors. Other special events include a group of club members who attend the Gathering of the Green in Daventryport, Iowa every other year. In the last several years a group of club RVers have been traveling to the mid west to attend the really large antique tractor and machinery shows such as the Rollag show in Minnesota and the Old Trusty Antique & Collector Show in Nebraska. Unfortunately the guys from Chehalis got burned out and after seven shows, the Chehalis Northwest EXPOs no longer exists. In 2010 the C2CC group

sponsored an EXPO VIII which was coordinated with the PSAT&MA John Deere featured tractor. Show chairmen were Greg Greenfield, Paul Hieb and Alerd Johnson. Shop tours started in 2002 and have ranged from Forks, Washington to lower British Columbia. A huge club accomplishment was the John Deere Museum constructed at the PSAT&MA show grounds. The project was started in 2007 and completed in 2008. Credit goes to Jim Galen, Fred Polinder, Paul Hieb and the officers and board members for making this project happen. The first tractor caravan was held in the summer of 2003 and toured the Skagit county back roads concluding with a barbeque. The caravans have continued every year since with tours of Whatcom, Skagit and Lopez Island. The Lopez Island tours are the most popular and are scheduled every other year thanks to Island members Jim Smith, Bob Burt and Ken Rose. Riding the Washington State Ferry with a tractor is really exciting! The club newsletter is published five times a year and a web page (www.C2CC.org) has been established. A featured club member is included in most editions and 59 members have been covered to date. We purposely do not report deceased members in our newsletters but Tom Jenson has organized a memorial plaque at the John Deere building in Lynden. This is our permanent way of honoring our members who have passed on. A membership directory including tractors is published each year and available to members on request. Our plan for the current year is to organize a restoration vender list of services available in Northwest Washington. Members Ken Langel, Tom Jensen, Bill McEnery, Bob Folk and C2CC events has been featured in the Green Magazine. Norm teSelle has been recognized in the Two Cylinder Magazine. The club has been featured in the Green Magazine with our John Deere museum and Lopez Island caravan. A spring plow day is conducted in Skagit County each year plowing as much as 100 acres. General membership meetings are conducted four times a year including popular




